## ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION N4VB

I, the undersigned natural person of the age of majority, acting as incorporator of a corporation under the Nebraska Nonprofit Corporation Act, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation.

#### ARTICLE I.

Name: The name of the Corporation is "N4VB."

#### ARTICLE II.

Public Benefit: The Corporation is a public benefit corporation.

#### ARTICLE III.

Duration: The period of duration of the Corporation is perpetual.

#### ARTICLE IV.

Initial Registered Office and Initial Registered Agent: The mailing address of the initial registered office of the Corporation is 5908 Dobsons Court, Lincoln, Lancaster County, Nebraska 68516, and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is Maggie Griffin.

#### ARTICLE V.

<u>Purposes</u>: The Corporation is organized exclusively as a nonprofit corporation for the purposes set forth in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code. Subject to the foregoing, the Corporation is organized exclusively for purposes which support charity, education, and fostering sports competition, specifically to expand access to quality volleyball training and programming for youth across Nebraska. By operating an inclusive volleyball facility in Lincoln, the Corporation aims to lower barriers to participation through affordable events, skill development opportunities, and financial assistance. The Corporation is committed to growing the game by fostering a positive, competitive, and supportive environment where all young athletes—regardless of background or income—can develop their potential on and off the court.

#### ARTICLE VI.

Powers: The Corporation shall have and exercise all powers and rights conferred upon corporations by the Nebraska Nonprofit Corporation Act and any enlargements of such powers and rights conferred by subsequent legislative acts or acts of the voters of the State of Nebraska; the Corporation shall have and exercise all powers and rights, not otherwise



denied nonprofit corporations by the laws of the State of Nebraska or by these Articles of Incorporation, as are necessary, suitable, proper, convenient or expedient to the attainment of the purposes set forth in Article V. The Corporation shall not have nor exercise any powers or rights which conflict with the purposes set forth in Article V.

The Corporation shall not have nor exercise any powers or rights which are not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) or which conflict with the purposes set forth in Article V.

#### ARTICLE VII.

#### Prohibited Transactions & Dissolution:

- A. The Corporation shall have no capital stock and shall declare no dividends. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article V hereof.
- B. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.
- C. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles of Incorporation, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the Corporation to such other exempt organization or organizations operating in the State of Nebraska which would then qualify as an exempt organization under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code at the time of dissolution. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the appropriate court of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

#### ARTICLE VIII.

Members: The Corporation shall have no members.

ARTICLE IX.

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Indemnification of Officers, Directors, Employees and Agents: To the extent permitted by the Nebraska Nonprofit Corporation Act, the Corporation shall indemnify its directors and may indemnify its officers and employees for liabilities and expenses incurred by reason of such individual being made a party to a proceeding because the individual is or was a director, officer, or employee of the Corporation.

# City Announces Proposal for New Youth Volleyball Facility

# Partnership with volleyball nonprofit would create more playing opportunities

Mayor Leirion Gaylor Baird and community representatives today said a partnership between the City of Lincoln and Nebraska for Volleyball (N4VB) to build a proposed volleyball facility at 30th and Folkways Blvd. would grow Lincoln's economy, create more playing opportunities for recreational volleyball players in the community and boost Lincoln's status as a youth sport destination.

"Our work to promote youth sports produces major wins for our kids, our local economy, and our vision to make Lincoln a premier location for youth sports," Mayor Gaylor Baird said. "These courts will attract more visitors to our community, stimulate our local economy, and affirm Lincoln's growing reputation as the volleyball capital of the nation."

Mayor Gaylor Baird announced that the City has agreed to be a co-applicant with N4VB to use the Sports Facilities Financing Act to fund construction of the new \$16 million facility.

The funding process would allow the portion of sales tax the State of Nebraska receives from purchases made near the new volleyball courts to be "turned back" and invested in the facility's construction. This would not be a new or increased tax, but a dedicated allocation of State sales tax revenue collected within 600 yards of the proposed facility. The City of Lincoln does not assume any financial liability by agreeing to be a partner.





N4VB estimates being able to finance about \$12 million of the \$16 million total construction cost with the turnback tax. The other \$4 million will be raised privately.

The process for use of the turnback tax first requires approval by the Nebraska governor and then approval by Lincoln voters in an election. A potential election is dependent on gubernatorial approval and is anticipated to take place sometime in 2026.

If approved, the facility would feature eight courts with the capacity to expand to 12.

Joining Mayor Gaylor Baird at the news conference were City Councilmember Sändra Washington; Diane Mendenhall, N4VB Board Member and Omaha Supernovas President; Andrew Lerner, Partner, The Lerner Company; and Derek Bombeck, Visit Lincoln Sports Director. Former Husker Volleyball Head Coach John Cook, who could not attend the news conference, provided video remarks.

Mendenhall said the new facility is designed to offer more recreational player opportunities, increase the number of weekend volleyball tournaments in Lincoln and provide those opportunities at a lower cost than clubs charge for competitive volleyball. More than half of players not admitted to local volleyball programs are excluded due to capacity constraints, not on the grounds of talent or ability, she said.

"We intend to create a world-class training facility for Nebraska's homegrown talent - without the world-class price of admission," Mendenhall said. "And in the process, we're setting a new standard for what's possible in the sport of volleyball, just as Nebraska has always done."

Bombeck said youth and amateur sports generated more than \$114 billion in economic impact nationwide in 2024. A new volleyball facility could bring those financial benefits to Lincoln, he said.

"We know that when athletes and their families visit Lincoln, they may come for the volleyball, but they will also eat in our restaurants, stay in our hotels, shop in our stories and explore our city," Bombeck said. "If we invest in ourselves, Lincoln can enjoy a bigger slice of that pie."

Lerner thanked all the partners for their work on the youth volleyball center project, a place he said that would "bring people together."



"Today marks an exciting milestone – not just for this development, but for the entire Lincoln community. This facility is more than just volleyball courts. It's a place where young athletes will grow, families will gather, and community will thrive," Lerner said.

Washington said the new facility helps meet the community's demand for court space and will attract players from across the region.

"By expanding access to the game, we promote youth physical and mental health, foster a lifelong love of volleyball, and reinvest revenue from youth sports tourism into City services that enhance everyone's quality of life," Washington said.

6	AN ELECTION UPON CONDITIONAL APPROVAL OF SUCH
7	APPLICATION; AND TO AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE OF REVENUE
8	BONDS FOR SUCH PROJECT.

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Lincoln, Nebraska:

Section 1. The City Council (the "Council") of the City of Lincoln, Nebraska, (the "City") hereby finds and determines as follows:

- (a) The Nebraska Legislature has enacted the Sports Arena Facility Financing Assistance Act, Nebraska Revised Statutes §§ 13-3101 to 13-3110 (the "Act"), to promote the construction and development of eligible sports arena facilities within the State of Nebraska, with such facilities to include sports complexes and related concessions areas, parking facilities and onsite administrative offices connected with operating the sports complex.
- (b) The City is a city of the primary class in the State of Nebraska, and the Act provides financial support from the State of Nebraska in the form of the remittance of a portion of the State sales tax collected on certain transactions in an area around an approved project, subject to the limitations under the Act (the "Turnback Tax").
- (c) Under the Act, the City may join with a nonprofit corporation to jointly submit an application requesting the Turnback Tax to pay such costs of a privately-owned sports complex permitted by and under the conditions of Sections 13-3103(4) and 13-3110 of the Act. If the application is approved, and if the voters of the City approve of such project as an economic development project under Section 13-3110 of the Act, such Turnback Tax may be appropriated by the City and applied to pay back amounts expended or borrowed through one or more debt issues to be expended by the nonprofit corporation coapplicant to acquire, construct, improve, or equip the privately-owned sports complex, and to pay other costs as permitted by Section 13-3103(4).
- (d) Such a privately-owned sports complex must be (i) proposed by the City co-applicant as a sports complex economic development project, (ii) located within the corporate limits of the City, and (iii) approved by the voters of the City.
- 32 (e) N4VB, a non-profit corporation organized under the Nebraska Nonprofit Corporation Act 33 (the "Nonprofit Corporation"), has proposed the construction and development of a privately-owned

sports complex, with such privately-owned sports complex to be financed in part with revenue bonds issued by the City and to be repaid in part from the Turnback Tax.

- (f) The Nonprofit Corporation has proposed the construction of a privately-owned sports complex, as that term is defined in Section 13-3102(23), consisting of an enclosed, temperature-controlled building primarily used for competitive sports which contains at least six separate competition sports venues, (collectively, the "Sports Complex").
- (g) The Project will be owned by the Nonprofit Corporation and located within the corporate limits of the City at the time of construction.
- (h) It is advisable and appropriate for the City to authorize (a) the submission of a coapplication with the Nonprofit Corporation for assistance under the Act by officers of the City, (b) calling an election in the City on the question of whether the Sports Complex and related infrastructure improvements of the City shall be approved as an economic development project under the Act (the "Project"), and (c) the issuance of revenue bonds of the City to pay a portion of the Sports Complex.
- Section 2. The City shall join as co-applicant with the Nonprofit Corporation for assistance under the Act on the proposed Project. The City hereby authorizes the Mayor, Director of Urban Development, and Finance Director (each, an "Authorized Officer") to approve the form and contents of an application and all materials submitted therewith (the "Application") and to execute and submit the Application on behalf of the City in pursuance of the requirements of the Act to secure Turnback Tax for the Project which includes the Sports Complex to be owned by the Nonprofit Corporation.
- Section 3. The Act authorizes the City to order submission of the question to the qualified voters of the City at a special election or statewide primary or general election pursuant to the Election Act on the question of whether to authorize the City to establish a sports complex economic development project and appropriate the Turnback Tax for the Project. Upon conditional approval of the Application from the Sports Arena Facilities Financing Assistance Board under the Act (the "Board"), the City shall order submission of the following question to the qualified voters of the City at a special election or statewide primary or general election in accordance with the Act and the Election Act (the "Ballot Question"):

"N4VB, a Nebraska nonprofit corporation, and the City of Lincoln, Nebraska, propose to establish a volleyball sports complex economic development project by appropriating annually from state assistance received by the City pursuant to the Sports Arena Facility Financing Assistance Act for the purpose of funding a volleyball sports complex to be owned by N4VB, and related infrastructure improvements, which may include financing of the privately owned sports complex through the issuance of revenue bonds to be repaid from such state assistance.

Shall the City of Lincoln, Nebraska establish a volleyball sports complex economic development project as described above by appropriating annually from state assistance received by the City pursuant to the Sports Arena Facility Financing Assistance Act?"

#### VOTE FOR or AGAINST

I vote FOR authorizing the City to establish a volleyball sports complex economic development project and appropriate state assistance to such project.





1 I vote AGAINST authorizing the City to establish a volleyball 2 sports complex economic development project and appropriate state assistance to such project. Electors voting in favor of the proposition shall blacken the oval opposite the words "FOR" following such proposition, and electors voting against such proposition shall blacken the 5 6 oval opposite the words "AGAINST" following the proposition. 7 If a majority of the votes cast upon such question shall be in favor, then the governing body 8 of the City of Lincoln shall be empowered to establish and implement a sports complex 9 economic development project and appropriate the state assistance upon the terms and 10 conditions contained in the Sports Arena Facility Financing Assistance Act." Upon the conditional approval of the Application from the Board, but only after 11 Section 4. voter approval of the Ballot Question, the City may proceed with the requisite approvals to establish a sports 12 complex economic development project and, after such approvals and upon receipt of such Turnback Tax, 13 appropriate the Turnback Tax to the Nonprofit Corporation to be applied to pay back amounts expended or 14 borrowed through one or more debt issues to be expended by the Nonprofit Corporation to finance the 15 Sports Complex and for other permitted purposes under the Act for the Project. 16 The City of Lincoln is hereby authorized to issue revenue bonds for the Sports 17 Complex pursuant to Sections 13-1101 to 13-1110, which shall be payable from and secured by funds and 18 property provided by the Nonprofit Corporation, including receipts attributable to the Turnback Tax, and 19 20 shall not be a pecuniary liability of the City. The City shall approve the terms of such bonds upon conditional approval of the Application and approval of the Ballot Question by the voters. 21 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Resolution, before each 22 23 action is taken by the City related to the Application or calling an election for the Ballot Question, the Authorized Officers are hereby authorized to require funds from the Nonprofit Corporation sufficient to 24 cover the costs of the City related to preparation of the Application, calling the election for the Ballot 25 Question, and other administrative costs of the City related to the Sports Complex. The Authorized Officers are hereby authorized to do all things and execute all 27 Section 7. documents as may by them be deemed necessary and proper to complete and submit the Application and 28

## **Description of N4VB Program Statement**

# Program Description: Expanding Access to Youth Volleyball Through the N4VB Facility

#### Overview

N4VB (Nebraska for Volleyball), in partnership with the City of Lincoln, is launching a transformative initiative to increase access to youth volleyball by developing a dedicated, multi-court indoor facility in Lincoln. This facility will serve as a community anchor for year-round programming with a special emphasis on reaching underresourced and under-represented youth.

#### The Need

Despite the growing popularity of volleyball in Nebraska, many young athletes face barriers to participation—especially those from low-income families, rural communities, and racially or ethnically diverse backgrounds. Limited access to affordable facilities, transportation, and program costs create significant inequities in who gets to play, compete, and grow through sport.

#### **Our Solution**

The N4VB facility will directly address these challenges by offering:

- Low- and No-Cost Programming: Dedicated court time for subsidized clinics, open gyms, and development programs targeted at elementary and middle school youth from under-resourced areas
- School and Community Partnerships: Collaborations with Title I schools, afterschool programs, and nonprofit organizations to identify and engage youth who would not otherwise have access to organized volleyball.
- Scholarship-Based Club Teams: Expanded scholarship offerings for participation in competitive club teams and skill development programs operated by local clubs.
- Collaborative Transportation Access: While N4VB will not directly provide transportation, we are committed to partnering with organizations that already serve youth and offer transportation solutions, such as afterschool programs, churches, and community centers.
- Mentorship & Leadership Development: Volunteer opportunities, mentorship from high school and college athletes, and leadership training that extend beyond the court.



### **Impact Goals**

In the first year of operation, N4VB aims to:

- Serve hundreds of underrepresented youth through free or reduced-cost programming.
- Host **monthly outreach events** including free clinics, youth camps, and school-based volleyball nights.
- Award thousands of dollars in program scholarships to qualifying families.

#### Sustainable Model

This initiative is made possible through a hybrid operating model:

- Local Programs will lease court space for club teams, training, and events generating consistent revenue to sustain core facility operations.
- N4VB will direct fundraising efforts, grants, and community support to fund outreach programs, scholarships, and court access for under-resourced youth.
- Community-Driven Access: Rather than managing transportation directly, N4VB will focus on building partnerships with organizations already embedded in high-need areas to help bring youth to the facility efficiently and sustainably.

## **Long-Term Vision**

By 2029, the N4VB facility will be a hub not only for elite volleyball training but for **community building, youth empowerment, and equitable access** to sport. Together, Local club organizations and N4VB are committed to ensuring every child – regardless of background – has a place to play, grow, and belong.

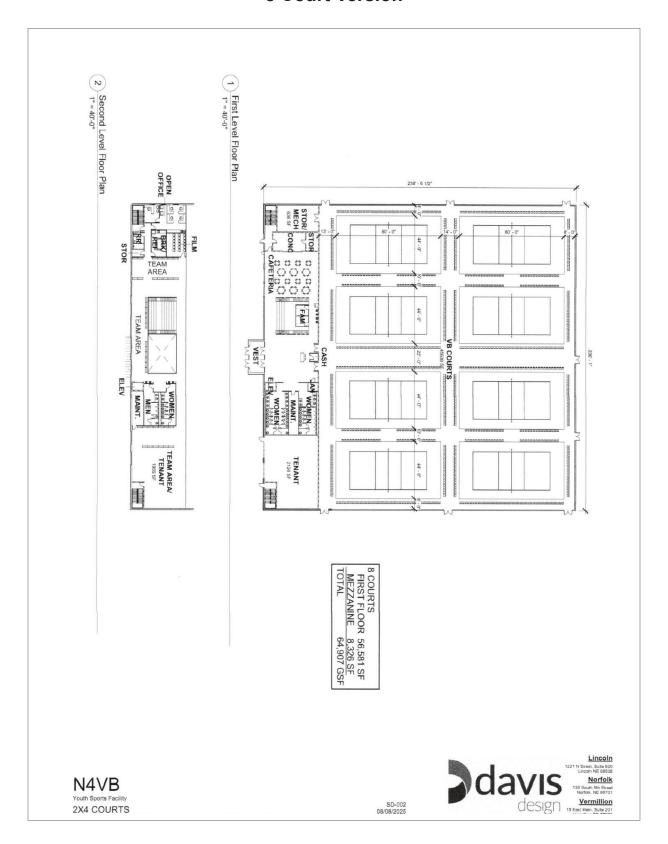

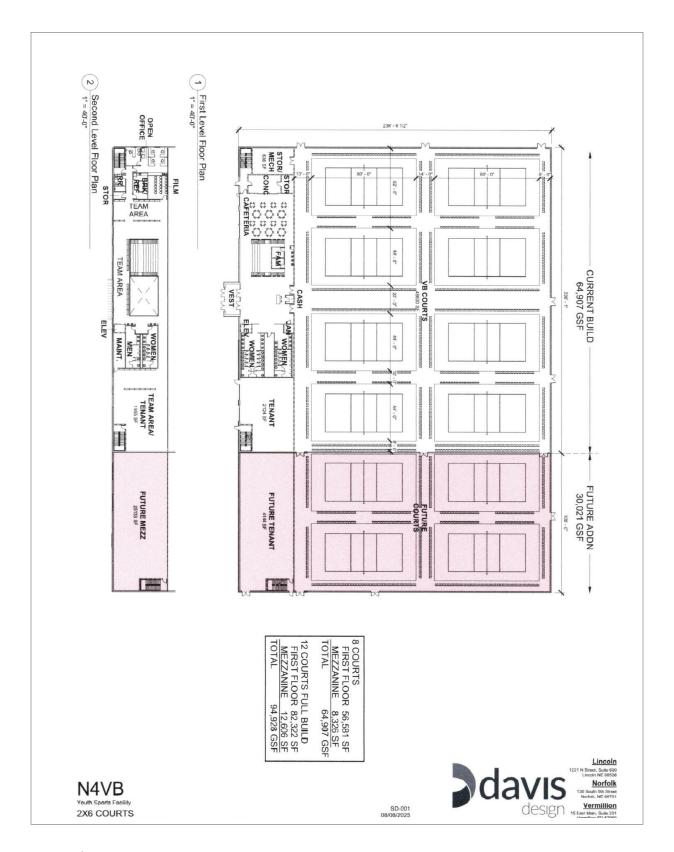
## **Sports Facility Renderings** 8 Court Version

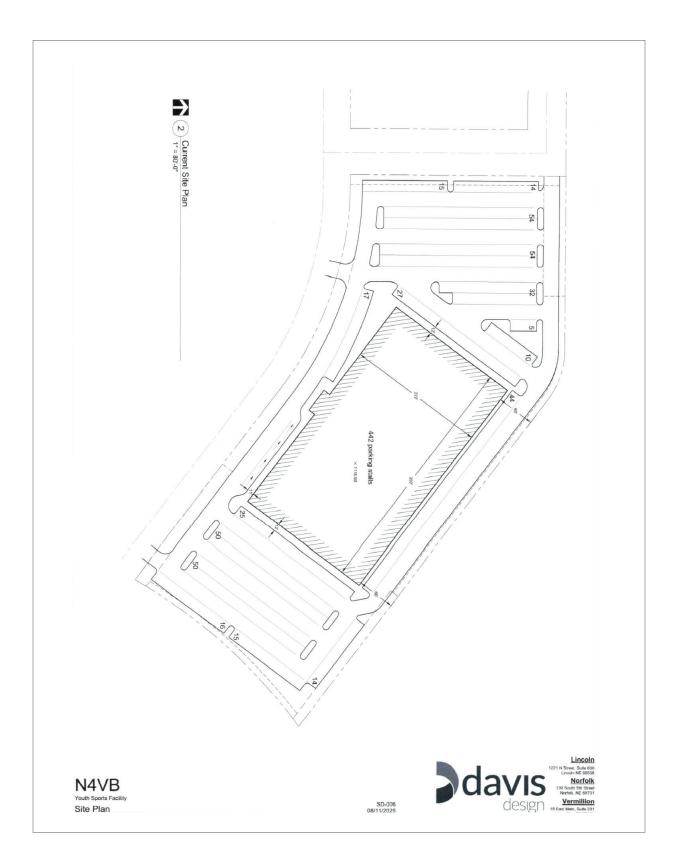
