2026 Report of the Statewide Ethanol Blend Rate

APRIL 30, 2026 (LINCOLN, NEB.) – Under the E-15 Access Standard Act (Act), the Nebraska Department of Revenue (DOR), in conjunction with the Nebraska Department of Water, Energy, and Environment, is reporting the statewide ethanol blend rate, as required by [Neb. Rev. Stat. § 66-2216](#).

The statewide ethanol blend rate is the average percentage of ethanol contained in each gallon of motor vehicle fuel (MVF) sold in this state. Under the Act, retail dealers of MVF are required to electronically file an Ethanol Blend Report (EBR) with the DOR each quarter, detailing the number of gallons of each type of MVF sold and the percentage of ethanol in each gallon.

Under the Act, if the statewide ethanol blend rate is below 14% as of the 2027 report (for calendar year 2026), retail dealers must begin selling E-15 gasoline from at least one qualifying motor fuel dispenser by January 1, 2028, unless certain exemptions apply, including a waiver as a small retail motor fuel site. Exemptions are granted by the Nebraska Department of Agriculture and are based in part on the required Forms EBR filed by the retail dealer.
