



# Important Information on Filing and Paying Your Sales and Use Taxes

#### What

Starting with the June 2013 filing of your Nebraska and Local Sales and Use Tax Return, Form 10, with the Nebraska Department of Revenue (Department), you are mandated to electronically file and pay all sales and use taxes due.

#### Why

In 2010, the Nebraska Legislature passed Neb. Rev. Stat. § 77-1784 authorizing the Tax Commissioner to mandate:

- Electronic filing of all tax programs, including sales and use tax returns;
- Electronic payment of sales and use taxes for taxpayers with annual payments exceeding a threshold amount of \$5,000; and
- A \$100 penalty for noncompliance in all tax programs, except individual income tax.

The Tax Commissioner has phased in threshold amounts over time to provide enough notice for taxpayers impacted by the mandates. You currently meet the electronic filing and payment mandate threshold of \$9,000 effective July 1, 2013.

# How To Electronically File using NebFile for Business

- There you'll find filing tips, step-by-step demonstrations, and the program to file your tax return.

# How To Electronically Pay

- Go to the Department's website at www.revenue.ne.gov.
- Under "Online Services," and "For Businesses," click on "Make a Payment."
- There, you'll find information about many electronic payment options:
  - o Department's e-pay (The State withdraws funds from your bank account based on the information you provide);
  - o ACH Credit (You work with your bank to deposit funds into the State's bank account);
  - o Nebraska Tele-pay (Pay by phone); and
  - o Credit Card payments.
